The Steinway Grand Piano Restoration Project

In 2011 The GHS Alumni Association embarked on a project to restore the 9' Steinway Grand Piano in the Auditorium. The Alumni Assn. decided that the piano should be restored because it is a high quality instrument and it should be a cornerstone to properly support the excellent Music and Performing Arts program at Grant. Who knows how many more Tom Grants or Thomas Lauderdales will get a world class piano to play at Grant.

The Alumni Assn. is coordinating the project with Chris Lane in the Grant Performing Arts Dept. and John Eisemann in the Music Dept.

Repair costs are estimated to be approximately \$13,500. To date repairs of loose case parts, replacement of a key top, tuning, re-voicing and the purchase of a new piano cover and have been completed. Remaining work includes rebuilding the belly of the piano, new strings, pin blocks, tuning pins and reconditioning of the soundboard and bridge.

As of June 2013 the project has raised about \$6000. In January we began the KEYS TO SUCCEED campaign where a \$100 contribution buys a key and will place the name of each KEY donor on a memorial banner in the auditorium to commemorate the project.

We have recently received a **\$3000 CHALLENGE GRANT** to get this project over the top from the friends and family of **Dorothy H. Taylor** who are offering a challenge grant of \$3000 in honor of her love of music and encouragement of young musical artists. As a member of the board of the Portland Junior Symphony (now the Portland Youth Philharmonic) Dorothy was privileged to audition young musicians for positions in the symphony. One of her greatest pleasures was having the Royal Blues gathered around her 1904 Steinway Grand piano for her parties when her youngest daughter, Janie, was at Grant. Please join her daughters in restoring the Steinway at Grant so that many more generations of aspiring musicians and singers can benefit from this fine instrument.
