# **The Grand Piano Project**

In 2011 The GHS Alumni Assn. began a project to raise funds to restore the 9' Steinway Grand Piano in the Auditorium. Since the condition of the piano was less than optimal, the Alumni Assn. decided that this high quality instrument should be restored to be a cornerstone of support for the excellent music and arts program at Grant. The project is in coordination with Chris Lane in the Grant Performing Arts Program.

The opening event in this fund raising effort was the Tom Grant – Royal Blue Alumni Choir concert in October 2011. Funds were also solicited at the Spring Musical "Hair Spray" at GHS and many alumni have contributed to the cause.

Repair costs are estimated to be approx.

\$13,500. The concert together with contributions to date have raised about \$4000 of which \$545 has been spent repairing loose case parts, replacing a key top, tuning, and the purchase of a new piano cover. Remaining work includes rebuilding the belly of the piano, new strings, pin blocks, tuning pins and reconditioning of the soundboard and bridge.

To raise the balance needed to successfully complete the restoration the Alumni Assn. is launching the KEYS TO SUCCEED campaign. Donors who contribute \$100 for the purchase of a "KEY" will spread the load among many and raise the balance to complete the project. The name of each Key donor will appear on a memorial poster in

the auditorium to commemorate the project. Most important the Performing Arts Program at Grant will again have a high quality instrument. Who knows how many more Tom Grants or Thomas Lauderdales will get a world class piano to play at Grant!

# A Colton Meek Remembrance From Mary Hubbard Flores '53

I have been away from Portland for many years but am so pleased you have chosen to honor Colton Meek. I still remember (1952 or 3) when a crank call was made during assembly that the upper balcony had collapsed. If I recall the caller was not a student. Colton Meek addressed us explaining what had happened, how many emergency vehicles had arrived at the scene and the hundreds of calls from those concerned about injuries. He was beyond anger and he was brilliant.

#### 2012 Hall of Fame Induction

Eleven former Grant athletes and one coach were 2012 inductees into the Hall of Fame. Also honored were ten championship swimming teams. The boys won 7 consecutive state championships (1950-56), an incredible record that still stands, while the girls were state champs in 1949 and 1958. Some "younger" boys won another state championship in 2010.

Judy Cornell DeRego, Class of '51, was one of Grant's greatest swimmers. She set a state record in the 100 yard backstroke and went on to win medals in AAU and Olympic competition (Helsinki Olympics in '52).

Some swimmers came from long distances for this memorable program on October 15 in the Grant auditorium. Jim Torrance came from Dallas, Texas, and Dick Dresie swam all the way from the Kona coast of the big island of Hawaii.
