Constitution Team places in top 10



Thirty seniors on the Grant High Constitution Team competed in the National Finals of the Center for Civic Education's <u>We the People: The Citizen and the Constitution Program competition held April 22-25</u>, and placed 7th.

The team qualified for the National Competition by placing 1st in the Oregon State competition, held January 29. This is the second year in a row that Grant placed 1st in the State Competition, and the 17th time Grant has competed in the National Competition since the program started in 2000. Grant has placed in the Top 12 since 2004, and placed first in the National Competition in 2013, 2015, and 2018.

For the competition, students are divided into six different subject matter units. They engage in an intense year-long study of the Constitution, its philosophic background, its history, its role in American life, and its application to modern problems. At the state and national level, each unit writes and presents answers to prepared questions developed by the Center, and then answers follow-up questions by an expert panel of judges. Team members end up with graduate school-level knowledge pertaining to their questions.

The team is taught by Grant teacher, Angela DiPasquale. Community volunteer coaches include Portland lawyer, Tim Volpert, and Grant Con Team Alums Meagan Gleason, Eamon McMahon, Jayden Dirk, and Alec Mouser.

The competition is normally live, but during COVID it has been conducted virtually. This year, however, though the national competition was virtual, Grant's team was able to travel to Washington as it did pre-COVID. Students were able to visit the National Archives, Smithsonian Museums, Supreme Court, Capitol, Lincoln Memorial, King Memorial, Vietnam Memorial, Korean War Memorial, National Gallery of Art, and National Portrait Gallery. These visits helped bring alive everything they had spent so much time studying over the course of the last year.

2022 GHS Hall of Achievement



Sigrid A. Fehrenbacher Clark, Class of 1958: Sigrid began playing the violin when she was 8, was a member of the Grant orchestra, and spent 37 years with the Oregon Symphony. While studying at GHS she was a member of G-Note, and Chresto, as well as the orchestra, plus she was an officer in all these groups. A National Honor Society member, Sigrid studied at Portland State after graduating from Grant. Additionally, Sigrid was a successful business woman. She was co-owner of the Goose Hollow Inn and Mother Goose Antiques. Her husband, past Portland Mayor Bud Clark, credits her with giving him the confidence to run for mayor. In 2001, the Clark family opened The Fehrenbacher Hof next door to The Goose. The coffee house honors Sigrid, as well as her sister, Frieda (see below). Sigrid passed much too early in February, 2001.



Frieda M. Fehrenbacher, Class of 1963: Frieda was the Girl's League executive secretary, student body secretary, and was selected as an outstanding Grantonian Girl of the Term while at Grant. She was a gifted musician, studying violin for fourteen years. A member of the National Honor Society, Frieda continued her studies at Portland State and earned a degree in painting and drawing, as well as a master's in fine arts from Syracuse University. "A committed and well-liked teacher," Frieda spent 28 years teaching drawing and design at Moore College in Philadelphia, and was the first Moore faculty member to be awarded the Lindback Award for distinguished teaching. Frieda's artwork—primarily pastel drawings and abstract paintings—was displayed in many Philadelphia galleries, and The Portland Hof coffee house includes one as well. Frieda passed in January, 2000.



John Hamnett, Class of 1963: John was a member of the Grant tennis team and continued playing throughout his life. He played the alto clarinet in the band and served as a band officer. He worked on class assemblies and was part of the stage crew. John graduated from Oregon State with a degree in business. He later earned a master's in taxation from Portland State. John worked for Willamette Industries for thirty-three years retiring as the tax compliance manager. When John's classmate Bob Burdett passed away, John generously offered to take over the alumni website, grantalumni.org. He not only maintained the site but also grew and improved it. John was instrumental in the success of the mural project fund raising and was always willing to help. We will miss his work ethic and Grant spirit. Sadly, John passed away May 9, 2022.



Joe Simpson, Class of 1968: Joe was a member of the Grant track teams ('67 PIL champions and '68 State champions), the football team, and was elected into the Grant Athletic Hall of Fame in 2012. Joe sang in the Senior Choir and was an officer in the Clefs Club. He graduated from Linfield College, where he participated in football and track and field. After earning his master's from Lewis & Clark, Joe returned to Grant in 1972 as assistant freshman football coach, then quickly became the varsity football and track coach, all while teaching social studies. Joe retired as a vice principal in 2002 after 30 years supporting Grant. Although officially retired, Joe continued to mentor new administrators and substitute for principals in the PPS system. Joe resides in Northeast Portland and continues to be active in the community.



John Hamnett: a General to the core

It is with great sorrow that we announce the passing of **John Hamnett**, Class of 1963.

John was a friend and colleague of not only the Grant High Alumni Association Board, but a long-time loyal friend of his alma mater, Grant High School. John served the Grant High Alumni Association Board for six years as webmaster, contributing immensely to insure that the Alumni Association maintained a close and thoughtful association with Grant High.

Most recently, John served on the committee that identified and successfully raised over \$200,000 to restore the irreplaceable Ideals of Education murals in the school auditorium. He led the committee's efforts to alert alumni, community groups, and neighbors of the necessity to restore the murals, helped early on to secure the approval of both the Portland Public Schools and the

Grant High administration to raise funds to restore the murals, and led a gallant but unsuccessful effort to restore and keep the murals in place. John was responsible for developing a relationship with the family of W. T. Fletcher, who was Grant's first principal and in whose memory Grant students commissioned the murals, as well as the National Coalition Against Censorship and The Leo Lester Browne Charitable Fund. We know John's leadership insured the success of alerting alumni of the needed restoration which resulted in securing their generous donations. As important as the fundraiser was, equally important was another positive result that brought together hundreds of alumni in support of their high school.

Grant High will miss you John and all that you have done to keep the Grant High spirit alive. There is a message carved on the Skidmore Fountain in downtown Portland that we believe describes John: "Good Citizens are the Riches of a City."


- This Summer Newsletter is being emailed to all alumni for whom we have a current email address.
