Alumni Assn. Names Hall of Achievement Honorees

Grant's Hall of Achievement, started in 2012 by the U.S. Grant High School Alumni Association, has added four more annual candidates. This is the fourth group of four inductees.

They are Lorry Lokey '44, Larry Black '47, Mike Powell '58, and Sally Struthers '65. They join Ulysses S. Grant, the honorary first member, and Principal Colton Meek, author Beverly Bunn Cleary, astronaut Charles Gordon Fullerton, Interior Secretary Don Hodel, Mayor Connie Averill McCready, aeronaut Edward Curtis Wells, entrepreneur Gert Lamfrom Boyle, physician J. Michael "Jack" Carroll, athletic promoter Jim McGregor, judge Robert Jones, advertising genius Dan Wieden, and Grant speech instructor Opal Hamilton.

Lorry Lokey '44, graduated from Stanford University. In 1961 he founded "Business Wire" a communication business that was sold in 2006 to Warren Buffet. A WWII vet, he has three daughters, and lives in Indian Wells, California and Hawaii. He has donated millions generously to a number of charitable and educational institutions including U. of O., PSU, Stanford, and Alameda grade school.

Larry Black '47, incidentally an all-city tackle on a state championship football team at Grant, founded an internationally acclaimed stock brokerage in Portland, Black & Co. with a seat on the New York stock exchange, and was instrumental in arranging financing for numerous local businesses. Larry lives in Lake Oswego with his wife, Susan, with whom he has five daughters, and is a life member of your Grant High alumni association.

Mike Powell '58, joined his father Walter's City of Books in 1979, took over in 1982 and built it into the internationally famous store in Portland, always listed as a major tourist attraction in the City Of Roses, and is probably the world's largest independent bookstore. The store has brought numerous authors here for public appearances. Mike lives in Portland with his wife, Alice. The store has been sold to daughter Emily.

Sally Struthers '65, is one of several nationally famous Grantonians in the entertainment field. Starting in 1971 she starred as Gloria in the hit TV series "All in the Family", winning Emmys and Golden Globes. She also appeared in other TV shows, movies, and Broadway. She lives in Los Angeles, still acting in various venues. She has a daughter, Samantha.

Rose Festival Princess Olivia Wolfe

Olivia Wolfe, Grant's 2016 Rose Festival Princess played three years of varsity tennis and was a member of National Honor Society, Black Student Union, the swim team, coed rec soccer, Nothing but Treble A Cappella group, and Royal Blues. 2016 Scholarship Awarded to Joshua Webb



The GHS class of 2016 is 337 strong and 150 of those students applied for scholarships with 42 awarded financial assistance. Your 2016 Alumni Assn. scholarship recipient is Joshua Webb who was awarded \$2500, which included a generous donation from the class of 1963.

Josh transferred to Grant his junior year from De La Salle North Catholic. He quickly became part of the Grant community joining the Black Student Union, Equity Team, and the award winning Grant Magazine. Josh was part of the team that wrote the impressive N-Word issue in March (grantmagazine.com). That same month there were race talks in every classroom as a result of the team's efforts. Josh was one of three who produced a video that everyone at Grant viewed. The video outlined protocols for the race talks.

Outside of school, Josh has volunteered at the Oregon Food Bank and is now the lead photographer for his church.

Josh will attend Oregon State University to study computer technology planning to be a software engineer not only because he likes computers and what they do for us, but also to be a role model for younger black students who do not have a representative in the computer field.

Josh is an exemplary student and we wish him every success at OSU and beyond!

Grantonians in the News

Andrew Brenner '16 is one of ten Oregon students to receive an Evans Scholarship which will pay for full tuition and housing at the University of Oregon for the next four years. The Western Golf Assn. provides most of the funds for the scholarships. Evans recipients are selected for outstanding leadershp, character, excellent academics and a strong caddie record.

Jennifer Vandever '86, has had her second book published. American Tango follows her first novel The Bronte Project which The Christian Science Monitor called "wickedly clever." The second book, published by an independent publishing house, explores liberal Portland rituals.

Vandever teaches at Emerson College.

Grant Constitution Team

The Grant Constitution Team placed third in the national "We the People" Constitutional legal competition. Last year's team won the national title with Lincoln winning first prize this year. No state has won more national titles than Oregon. Teams spend hours learning about constitutional law with the help of volunteer coaches and teachers. U.S. Rep. Earl Blumenauer spoke on the House floor offering his congratulations. "These teenage scholars, most not old enough to vote or drive, compete in a contest demonstrating their knowledge of the Constitution and democratic principles, as well as their ability to think fast on their feet," said Blumenauer.

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Authors Visit Grant

Grant was one of the first schools involved with the Writers in the Schools program created by Literary Arts. In the past five years, Grant students have had the amazing opportunity to work with Jeffrey Toobin, Ruth Ozeki, Chimamanda Adichie, Adam Gopnik all who spent time at Grant. Students also attended lectures presented by Sherman Alexie, Salman Rushdie, Justice Sonia Sotomayor, and Michael Chabon. This spring Sports and Entertainment Marketing students were invited to see Phil Knight and Adam Gopnik talk about Knight's memoir, *Shoe Dog.*

Grant High School Remodel

The first stage in the modernization of Grant High School—"schematic design" in the language of architectures—is just about wrapped up. The design is the result of a 9-month planning process, led by Mahlum Architects and the Portland Public Schools Office of School Modernization, with input from a community-based design advisory committee, Grant staff, students, and community members participating in a series of public workshops.

We are excited by the new design—you can get all the gory details at http://www.pps.net/Page/474. There's a quick one-minute video, and the slideshow of the schematic design workshop has great visuals (you can cut to the chase by going to slide 38).

Some highlights:

- The front of the school will look largely the same. "Grant's Tomb"—that big cube of concrete that houses some plumbing—will be removed, the stairs will be slightly altered, and there will be better wheelchair access.
- The main building will be a bit wider, the better to accommodate modernized classrooms, with flexible and informal spaces for small groups and individual study scattered throughout the school.
- Bye-bye "new" gym, science building, library, cafeteria, dark cruddy unconnected basements. The back of
 the building will get a big makeover. A new double gym will be added on the south side of the main building. New
 science classrooms and labs, including a STEM lab. New library and commons/learning café on the main floor,
 plus other smaller food areas. The basements get connected and opened up on the west end to let the sun shine
 in.
- Hello, new "old" gym. The "old" gym will become an art and engineering center. With the "new" gym gone, we'll be able to truly appreciate the wonderful classic architecture of this building, with a plaza/amphitheater in front.
- Hello, girls' softball team, which has been forced to use Wilshire Park for years. There will be fields at Grant for ALL of our athletes. Plus a new weight room, batting cage, indoor track and other facilities.
- A revamped auditorium, with bigger, comfortable seats, great acoustics, and a modern backstage area—but with the same old weirdly-cool Egyptian-like murals.
- Last but not least: new bathrooms that will set a design precedent. Each bathroom will have a common area
